

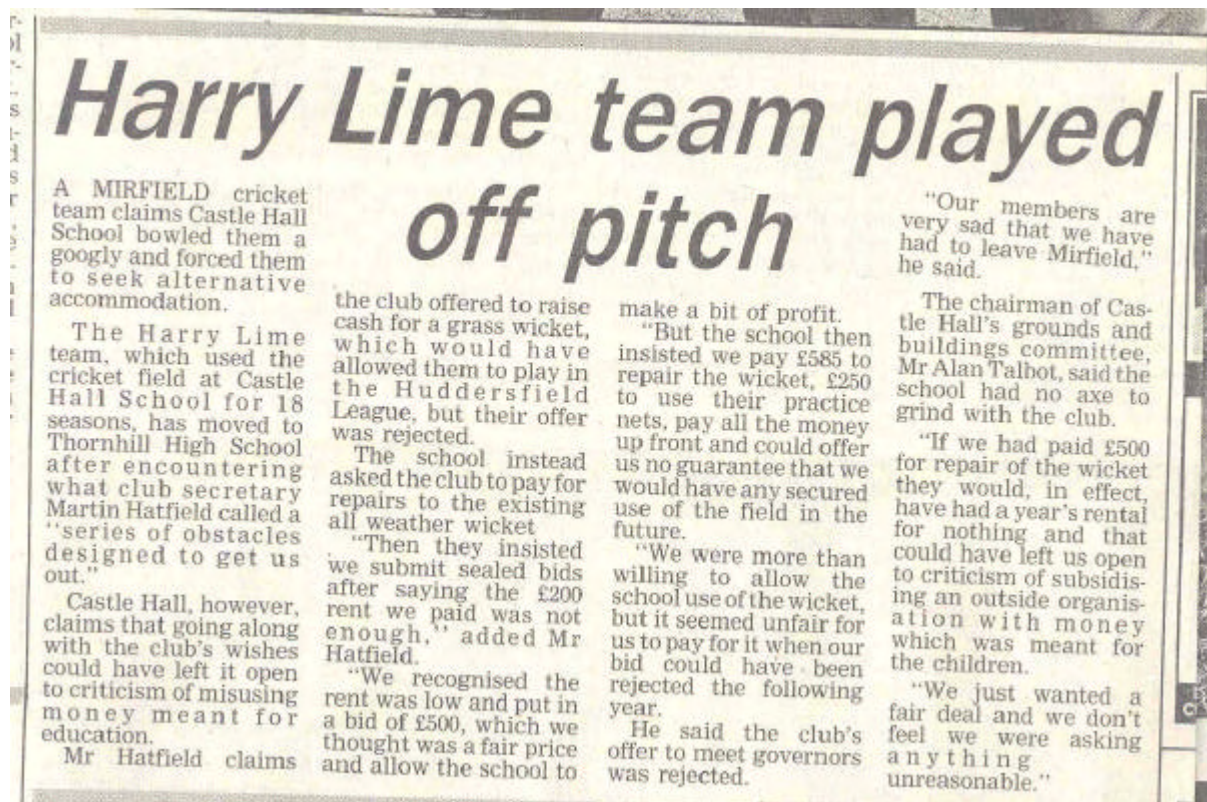

1995 – Ground Move

In 1995, and after 18 years, Harry Lime were forced to leave their HQ at Castle Hall School.

It was a controversial move, with Club spokesman Martin Hatfield claiming that they had been presented with a 'series of obstacles designed to get us out'.

2003 – Edgerton Controversy

Up until 2002, Harry Lime had a squad with depth and were able to field two teams in the Central League.

However, in 2003 they had to scrap their 2nd XI because of a shortage of players, a move that had serious consequences, not just on the playing side - their strength in depth had gone - but also in terms of where they played their cricket.

The trustees of the famous Bradley Mills ground – where Harry Lime resided at the time - wanted tenants who would make use of the ground every weekend, not just every other Saturday, and so Edgerton C.C. got the nod over Harry Lime C.C.
